

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF CAPI

1. Provide technical support and serve as the coordinating body for the effective implementation of all activities aimed at securing the safety of school children on roads across Nigeria.
2. Oversee and coordinate the implementation of all program activities to ensure alignment with national accident-prevention needs for school children in basic and secondary schools.
3. Facilitate the expansion and scaling up of the program in accredited schools across Nigeria.
4. Provide technical assistance and advisory support, including the production and distribution of customized reflective safety materials for school children and schools.
5. Monitor and supervise the list of accredited schools benefiting from the initiative, ensuring compliance with established program criteria.
6. Ensure adherence to national safety standards and principles in the implementation of all aspects of the program.
7. Coordinate the phased implementation of all program components, including policy formulation, review, and adjustment where necessary.
8. Establish and operate a help desk / information centre to support critical program initiatives, including:
 - Customized reflective safety jackets for school children
 - Road-crossing guard uniforms
 - Patrol vehicles, ambulances, and first-aid kits for pilot and full implementation
9. Design the project's framework and implementation work plan, ensuring clear timelines, objectives, and performance indicators.
10. Identify and engage relevant stakeholders, including local and international donors, government bodies, and development partners, to support the project.

11. Distribute customized reflective jackets and armbands to school children in basic and secondary schools across Nigeria, free of charge and in phases.
12. Train school teachers to serve as matrons, patrons, and road-crossing guards within designated school safety zones.
13. Provide first aid kits, ambulances, and pre-hospital emergency care support for school children in case of accidents.
14. Construct or facilitate the construction of modern zebra crossings, speed breakers, road signage, pedestrian bridges, and school-transport safety systems where required.
15. Establish zonal and state command offices, emergency clinics, sick bays, and safety clubs in schools to support safety interventions.
16. Conduct advocacy and awareness campaigns through media, roadshows, and public engagements to educate road users on children's safety.
17. Actively participate in all correspondences, visits, and activities related to program implementation across all 36 states and the FCT.
18. Submit periodic reports on project progress, implementation outcomes, sponsor updates, and recommendations for continuous improvement.
